With a 1.5" DM-6 proprietary Heil diaphragm element, the PR 40 dynamic mic boasts the widest frequency range of any Heil microphone, and is constantly compared to condenser mics that cost much more. From 28 Hz to 18 kHz, the PR 40 provides the smoothest, clearest and most natural sound available.

As with other Heil mics outfitted with dual mesh screens and element filters, the PR 40 refuses to pop (the sound that happens when one nestles in too close to the mic before speaking or singing). This alone would make the PR 40 a good mic, but when combined with all the other features, this microphone is in the superstar category.

The PR 40 is an end-fire cardioid pattern dynamic microphone, so it's great for miking drums, guitar and bass; and there is no fear of leakage of neighboring sounds due to its excellent side and rear noise rejection.


The PR 40 has become a go-to mic for broadcast facilities world-wide. It's also perfect for podcasts, voice-overs and live on-air talent.
